

## **Andrew D. Levy**

Andy Levy is a trial lawyer from Baltimore, Maryland. His practice focuses on civil, criminal, and appellate litigation.

Andy has frequently acted as counsel in efforts to establish group homes for persons with disabilities in the face of active community resistance, and he was lead counsel in the landmark case, *Potomac Group Home Corp. v. Montgomery County, Md.* He obtained the first judgment in the country under the design & construction requirements of the Fair Housing Amendments Act in the *Baltimore Neighborhoods v. Rommel Builders* series of cases.

He is a Fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers, and is listed in *Best Lawyers in America* in both the “Criminal Defense” and “Business Litigation” categories.

Among the awards that Andy has received are the Stanley S. Herr Advocacy Leadership Award from the Arc of Baltimore; the Robert Dole Award from Volunteers for Medical Engineering; the Benjamin L. Cardin Pro Bono Service Award from the University of Maryland School of Law Alumni Association; the League for People with Disabilities’ Disability Advocacy and Awareness Award; and the Maryland Bar Foundation Professional Legal Excellence Award for Advancement of the Rights of the Disadvantaged.

Andy is also an adjunct professor at the University of Maryland School of Law. Some of the course he has taught over the years are Torts, Criminal Law, Evidence, and Trial Practice. His publications include *Levy, Hornstein & Weissenberger, Maryland Evidence Courtroom Manual* (LexisNexis); and *Sandler & Levy, eds., Appellate Practice for the Maryland Lawyer: State and Federal*, 3rd ed. (MICPEL 2007).
