### **Hollywood**

Take the Red Line from Pershing Square "southbound" to Hollywood & Highland  
Check out the Hollywood Highland Center (including the Kodak Theater, where the  
Oscars are held)

Walk around - see Grauman's Chinese Theater and the other sights along Hollywood  
Boulevard

Continue further out on the Red Line to Universal Studios - take the tour

### **Pasadena Area**

#### **The Huntington Library, Art Collections, and Botanical Gardens**

(famous for Gainsborough's *Blue Boy*)

San Marino

Take Metro Red Line from Pershing Square Station to Union Station

Transfer to Metro Gold Line to Allen Avenue Station (next to last stop)

Take Pasadena Area Rapid Transit System bus # 10 south to Allen Avenue and  
Del Mar Road

Walk six blocks south on Allen Avenue until it dead-ends at the entrance gate at  
Orlando and Allen

#### **The Norton Simon Museum of Art**

Pasadena

Take Metro Red Line from Pershing Square Station to Union Station

Transfer to Metro Gold Line to Memorial Park Station

Walk two blocks south to Colorado Boulevard

Take Pasadena Area Rapid Transit System bus # 10 west to museum

### **Miracle Mile**

#### **Los Angeles County Museum of Art (LACMA)**

Take the Metro Rapid (red) # 720 bus (headsign "Santa Monica") from the NW  
corner of 5th and Grand to NE corner of Wilshire & Fairfax

Drop-off is in front of LACMA West - walk east to main LACMA entrance

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Return trip on Rapid 720 will drop off on 6th Street between Hope and Grand, approximately 1 block south of the Biltmore

-or-

Take the Metro Purple Line from Pershing Square to the end of the line at Wilshire & Western, then transfer to the Metro Rapid 720 to Wilshire & Fairfax

**Page Museum** (The Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County)

Just east of LACMA at 5801 Wilshire Boulevard, the Page Museum features pre-historic fossils from the late Pleistocene recovered from the La Brea Tar Pits, including mammoths, dire wolves, sabertoothed cats, & mastodons.

### **Disneyland®**

You can take the train to Disneyland. Take the Metro Red Line or Purple Line subway from Pershing Square to Union Station. Take the Metrolink Orange County Line ([www.metrolinktrains.com](http://www.metrolinktrains.com)) or the faster Amtrak Pacific Surfliner ([www.amtrak.com](http://www.amtrak.com)) from Union Station (LAX) to the Anaheim Station (ANA). From there, either take the Anaheim Resort Transit Route 15 bus, which will take you directly to the Disneyland® Resort, or take the OCTA Bus Route 50 and exit at the Katella-Harbor Blvd. stop with a short walk along Harbor Boulevard (approx. 3 blocks) to the Disneyland® Resort.

Train fares:

| Metro subway: | \$ 1.25 each way   |
| Metrolink:    | \$14.25 roundtrip weekdays, \$10.75 weekends, less for seniors, disabled, and youths on weekends |
| Amtrak:       | \$20.00 roundtrip coach, \$40.00 business class  |

Check the web sites for train schedules. Remember that Metrolink is a commuter service, so that southbound trains to Anaheim are infrequent in the morning, and northbound trains are infrequent in the afternoon and non-existent in the evening.

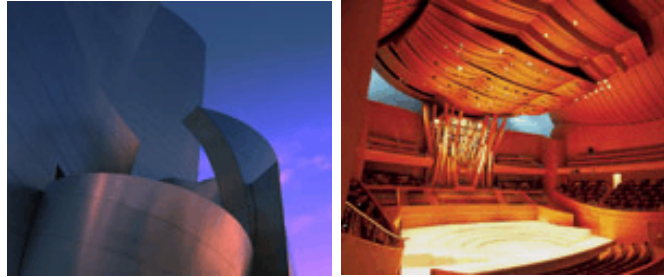
